**WHEREAS**, Emergency management measures are required to reduce the severity of a significate event which would:


- A. Seriously affect the health, safety or welfare of a substantial number of citizens of Collegeville Borough or preclude the operation or use of essential public facilities and services, or






**WHEREAS**, On March 23, Governor Tom Wolf issued a Stay-at-Home order for Montgomery County until at least April 6, 2020, and


**WHEREAS**, Emergency management measures are required to reduce the severity of a significate event which would:
