# COLLEGEVILLE BOROUGH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES APRIL 6, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 6:30PM by Council President Cathy Kernen.

<u>ROLL CALL</u>: President Cathy Kernen, VP Gary Hoffmann, Marion McKinney, Kathy Costello, Valarie Beckius, Dean Miller and Mayor Aidsand Wright-Riggins. (Craig Farr absent)

**MOTION** to approve the minutes from the March meeting by Costello with a second by Hoffmann **MOTION** carries 6-0

<u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>: Jan Snovel 432 Chestnut St asked if we could look into construction debris near the Freeland Square work site as two of her neighbors have gotten flat tires driving by there. Mr. Leh said he will address with the builder.

Terri Stagliano noted that the electrical box that lights the park sign at 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue needs to be reset.

**MOTION** to approve checks #5425-5477 and to pay the bills totaling \$154,154.52 by McKinney with a second by Costello

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT: Ms. Kernen reported that at their March 28 meeting, they discussed the status of the new College Gateway Overlay District Zoning, the borough's grant application for a Main Street Master Plan, and Ursinus College's commitment to our Main Street. They also heard an update on the former DaVinci's Pub, information on the borough's work toward cleaning up the blighted Perkiomen Bridge Hotel and a new development regarding the proposed Reading to Philadelphia Rail Line. Ms. Kernen noted several new businesses opened in the borough: G&S Style <a href="www.gsstylehomedecor.com">www.gsstylehomedecor.com</a>, Yoga Six and The Barn Yard Kids <a href="www.barnyard4kids.com">www.barnyard4kids.com</a>. She encouraged everyone to support these new ventures.

<u>REGIONAL PLANNING:</u> Ms. Beckius reported that at their meeting this month there was a representative from Montgomery County Planning Commission who gave a presentation on the Climate Change Potential Volume Analysis. It is available on the county website and allows anyone to see how climate change affects an area down to their neighborhood. It is a tool for better planning, the regional trail map is out! It has a QR code to access points of interest on the phone. It was reported that the median home sale price for Montgomery County is \$370K which is up 10.4%. Collegeville Borough median sales price is also up 14% at \$420K. The next meeting will be May 18.

<u>CTMA/PUBLIC WORKS:</u> Ms. McKinney noted that at the last meeting they paid the bills, approved an escrow release for Glenwood Reserve and approved bidding on a new dump truck for Public Works. Public Works purchased a sonar leak detector and it has proven to be valuable in finding leaks which cuts down on random drilling to find and repair leaks.

<u>LPVRSA:</u> Ms. Stagliano reported that the middle interceptor construction is progressing nicely. 79% of the work is completed. The duration of the project has been 999 days complete to date. They have projected completion in July of 2022, but she feels it will be more like October of 2022. Approximately 3300 linear feet remains to be installed of the original 16,800 linear feet. 45 of the 59 manhole covers have been installed. Evaluations and designs are still underway on the emergency generator, chemical building roof and grit building pipe replacement. Many preventive maintenance actions were performed.

<u>PARKS:</u> Ms. Costello reported that two concerts have been scheduled: Bigg Romeo <u>www.biggromeo.com</u>, on June 9 and The Bachelor Boys <u>www.bachelorboysband.com</u> on June 23. St Eleanor's is planning a spring cleanup of the park and playground areas soon. She thanked Mr. Gehringer from Ursinus for the new backstop at the ball field and said it has made a huge difference with the foul balls!

**MOTION** to approve using up to \$3500 to remove a tree from the park that is dead and leaning toward a home on Jonlyn Lane by McKinney with a second by Hoffmann

**MOTION** carries 6-0

**MOTION** to approve Resolution 2022-04, ratifying Ms. Twardowski as the borough representative to submit a grant application to resurface the basketball court and create an ADA accessible walkway around the park by McKinney with a second by Costello

**MOTION** carries 6-0

<u>PLANNING COMMISSION</u>: Over the last six months, the Planning Commission has worked on a College Gateway Overlay Ordinance that would encompass the four corners of 5<sup>th</sup> Ave and Main Street. The draft ordinance has been referred to Council for consideration of adoption. This new zoning, which concerns the area where the Ursinus campus connects with the top of our Main Street, encourages mixed use buildings with retail and restaurants on the first floor and residential housing or dorms above. The zoning respects our small-town character and encourages any new architecture to fit in with the current historical buildings on our Main Street. It also allows buildings up to fifty feet high to encourage development. In addition, it encourages a provides standards for a walkable and safe streetscape,

building setbacks, parking and infill between buildings, lighting, water features, art and gardens. It is important to remember that this does not change the zoning for any of the affected parcels. It allows an overlay zoning that the owner may utilize to develop the property if desired.

**MOTION** to approve advertising and scheduling a public hearing for the College Gateway Ordinance by McKinney with a second by Costello

**MOTION** carries 6-0

Craig Penuel stated that he thought that the Fire Company should have been involved in this discussion of the zoning on their property since it is part of the overlay. The response was that the zoning is not being changed, but rather an overlay would be added. It was noted that this overlay has been mentioned numerous times over the last few months and all meetings are open to all. Ms. Kernen noted that once Council approves the advertising of the new zoning, which occurred tonight, that begins the public review and comment period.

STREETS & PUBLIC SAFETY: No report

<u>ENGINEER:</u> Mr. Leh reported that we are approximately 50% complete with our field evaluation of the Borough roads. The traffic counts for the Second Avenue and Freeland Drive intersection is complete. Unfortunately, the results do not meet the threshold for consideration of a left turn arrow onto Freeland. Gilmore is working through a sanitary sewer conflict for the 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue culver with Joe Hastings. We hope to have our general permit applications submitted to PA-DEP next week.

# April 10-12 – "Welcome Home"

In July, 2021, Ursinus College began a collaboration with the Perkiomen Valley School District and the Delaware Tribe of Indians. This collaboration and the resulting Welcome Home Project recently led to the creation of a land acknowledgment statement which recognizes "that our community carries names derived from the Lenape language - names holding spiritual and cultural meaning while also bearing the remembrance of the systematic removal of the Lenape people over 250 years ago by European colonial powers, whose legacy still reinforces and benefits from the Lenape's disenfranchisement."

The acknowledgement also states that "Ursinus College commits to collaboration, representation, and inclusion as we work together with the Lenape people to bring about healing and reconciliation between and among all our communities."

Mayor Wright-Riggins will be participating in a meaningful moment in this collaboration, a special signing ceremony for the Ursinus College, Perkiomen Valley School District, and Delaware Tribe of Indians Statement of Mutual Intentions.
